The Online Voting Roundtable leverages the insights, experiences and research of government officials, experts and practitioners from around the world, and members of Indigenous communities to discuss the possible adoption of online voting in Canadian federal elections in light of the mandate of the Special Committee on Electoral Reform to explore the voting reform.

Discussion will focus on whether there is a climate for such a policy change, what policy implementation could look like, legal, operational and technical considerations, and the steps to be taken leading up to deployment in the short, medium and long-term. This dialogue will provide the basis for policy recommendations to the federal government.
